The Dipterocarps: Elders of the Forest

‘Dipterocarp’ means 2-winged fruit. They are iconic trees that constitute the backbone of Indo-Malayan rainforests.

They have great leaf-form diversity and the trees can grow up to 80 metres and live up to 1,000 years old.
