Yew Tee Integrated Development

Yew Tee Integrated Development comprises housing for the elderly and a mix of healthcare and community facilities including a hawker centre, Community Club, polyclinic, kidney dialysis centre, commercial shops and a community plaza, designed to support healthy living in a vibrant and inclusive environment.

Harmony Village @ Bukit Batok

Harmony Village @ Bukit Batok is the first pilot Community Care Apartments which integrates senior-friendly housing with care services. It is envisaged to foster a strong community spirit, with a myriad of shared spaces designed to encourage social interaction and active living. Within the block, residents can mingle and build social networks at the furnished communal spaces on each floor.



Residents will have access to an activity centre, roof garden, community garden, and precinct facilities to keep a healthy



The hawker centre in the development will provide a variety of food options to residents and the public.



The roof garden is equipped with precinct facilities such as strolling paths, children's playground and fitness stations.



The community garden is where residents can grow vegetables, herbs, and plants.
